

Subject Prize Policy

These are the general rules for the allocation of subject prizes, based on the annual **global** mark obtained by students at the end of the academic year. Students are awarded prizes for each subject taught in school.

Subject prizes are awarded to the top-scoring students in each subject in the annual examinations for Years 7 to 10, and in the mock final examination for Year 11.

Prizes are awarded to the **three top-scoring students in Track 3** and to the **top-scoring student in Track 2**.

In subjects where the number of students is **five or less**, one subject prize is awarded to the top-scoring student. In subjects where the number of students is **ten or less**, two subject prizes are awarded to the two top-scoring students.

Prizes are awarded based on the Annual Global Mark. In the event of a tie, the Annual Exam Mark shall be taken into account.

Subject prizes are awarded to students scoring **70% or above**. Students who do not sit for their annual examination on school premises shall not be eligible for subject prizes.

Special Prizes

- **Year 7 Merit Certificates:** Three students from each Year 7 class are awarded a merit certificate based on the following qualities:
 - Maturity in reasoning and attitude
 - Integrity and self-esteem
 - Responsibility
 - Diligence
 - Motivation
 - Generosity and altruism
- **Premju Speċjali għall-Kisbiet Sportivi:** a prize for excellence in sport achievement.
- **EkoSkola:** a certificate of participation for all members of the EkoSkola committee.
- **Il-Kunsill tal-Istudenti:** a certificate for leadership and initiative for all members of the school council.
- **Premju mogħti mill-Kap tal-Iskola:** għall-Impenn.
- **Premju Speċjali tal-Prinċipal tal-Kulleġġ:** għat-Tjubija.
- **Premju tal-President tal-Kunsill Skolastiku:** għad-Determinazzjoni.
